California high school seniors who meet income qualifications and have a minimum GPA of 2.0 are guaranteed financial assistance through the Cal Grant program. These grants do not need to be repaid and may be used for tuition, fees, books and access costs at eligible public or private two-year and four-year colleges and universities.

If you are not sure whether you meet financial-need requirements, apply anyway. The California Student Aid Commission periodically raises the income ceilings depending on the budget, and changes can occur that alter a family's situation. So, **APPLY ANYWAY**. You will not qualify if you do not apply. For information on income qualifications*, visit CALGRANTS.ORG.

**The California Student Aid Commission provides guidelines to determine whether you are eligible for financial aid; it is not the final determination of your financial need.*

Checklist of helpful information students and parents need to complete the application:

- Student's Social Security card & driver license (or government issued ID)
- Parent or guardian's Social Security card
- If not a U.S. citizen, bring alien registration cards
- Parent's Federal Income Tax return or current W-2 forms
- Records of untaxed income such as TANF, veteran's benefits, Social Security benefits
- Student's W-2 forms, pay records or records of income earned
- Bank account records or bank statements
- Records of stocks, bonds or investments
- Business records
- If you know the colleges you are interested in attending, bring a list
